They helped as affirm our slogan as the "Small Community with a Big Heart." Finally, both our Christmas Eve and Christmas day Masses included First Holy Communion for 33 children.

UNA REFLEXIÓN PARA NUESTRO TIEMPO

Parece casi obvio que la familia humana puede ser una imagen de la Trinidad. Como en la Trinidad hay tres personas unidas entre sí, así en la familia hay tres (o más personas) unidas entre sí. No obstante, la teología católica siempre ha abrigado dudas acerca del tema de la familia humana como imagen divina. Estas dudas tienen que ver con el carácter carnal de la familia humana (las personas divinas no pueden nacer físicamente una de otra) y con la subordinación de los hijos a los padres (las personas divinas son iguales y no conocen subordinación). Otro motivo importante, sin embargo, es porque las familias humanas no siempre se comportan como buenas imágenes de Dios, ya que pueden sufrir rupturas y violencia entre sus miembros. ¿A quién refleja nuestra familia, a la Trinidad o a la humanidad fragmentada y violenta?
